

**Scugog Soccer Code of Conduct, Rules and General Information**

All Parents, Players, Coaches and Officials agree to read and abide by the Code of Conduct.

**Payment**

Player's Registration form must be completed, and fees paid in full, before assignment to a team. Players who are not registered with the club are not authorized to play. Players with NSF cheques or incomplete forms or funds, will not be considered registered.

**Refund Policy**

All refunds must be applied for in writing with a copy of your receipt or cashed cheque, and are subject to a \$25.00 administration fee. **No refunds after June 15<sup>th</sup>**. Refunds applied for after the start of the season, will be pro-rated based on the number of games left after the return of uniform. Refunds take a minimum of three weeks to process.

**Late Registration**

Late players will be assigned to a team if there is space, or can be assigned to a waiting list. Late fees are \$25.00 per player (**after March 1, 2005**). Placement on a team is not guaranteed- late registrations will be refunded on June 15<sup>th</sup> if space does not become available

**Location**

All house league games U4 to U10 are played at the Scugog Soccer fields. Traveling teams play their home games at Scugog (away game locations are determined by the league they are members of).

**Equipment**

The Club provides the team uniform- shirt, shorts and socks for each player. Each player must have shin guards and soccer shoes. These are **mandatory**, and a player cannot enter the field without this equipment.

**Schedules**

A complete schedule of all games will be available at our website in early May, or from your coach. The team coach should be contacting his/her players by the second week of May. Play starts the week of May 23<sup>rd</sup> (note some traveling teams may start one week prior to this). The U4-10 season runs to the end of August.

**Referees**

Please advise the club if you are interested in refereeing. Referees must be 12 years of age, and attend a certification course as well as any clinics as determined by the Head Ref. These courses/clinics are scheduled prior to the start of the season.

**Coaches**

The club is always looking for volunteers to coach. The club actively supports our coaches by providing coach certification clinics (Youth I, II, and Senior) before the start of the season (contact the Head Coach to sign up, space is sometimes limited). A Coach General Meeting /Appreciation night will be held in early May.

**Coach Screening**

All coaches must submit to a Police check before the start of the season. Traveling team coaches must provide three reference checks.

**Traveling Rules**

Parents are responsible for arranging transportation to and from all games. New Ontario Soccer Association rules require coaches to have another adult in the vehicle at all times, when transporting players to games.
